In addition, Amira coordinates three capacity-building programs: Democracy School, the Summer Organizing Fellowship, and academic-year internships and fellowships.

Amira graduated from Tufts University in 2019, with a double major in international relations and Arabic. As an Arab-American, Amira has a wealth of experience in community organizing, in her hometown of Abu Dhabi, UAE, and at Tufts, where she worked on issues of racial diversity and education equity. Previously she worked for the Tufts Institute for Global Leadership and the Tufts Institute of the Environment, where she developed an analysis of the intersections the most compelling issues for her generation, from environmental justice to global conflict resolution.
