Prior to his appointment with the Executive Branch he held the position of Director of Outreach and Reentry for UTEC Inc. as well Assistant Deputy Superintendent at the Suffolk County Sheriff's Dept. previously.

Mr. Allah is well respected and versed within the field of re-entry and is often called upon for his professional expertise. His panelist credits include conferences hosted by Harvard Divinity School, Harvard Law School/Criminal Justice Institute, MassINC, the International Community Corrections Association, and the Massachusetts Association of Minority Law Enforcement Officers (MAMLEO). Having spoken on national platforms hosted by the U.S. Department of Justice, he was selected to participate in Cease Fire and in the national Value Based Initiative Focus Group. The winter 2003 edition of Commonwealth magazine wrote an article in which he was featured. Additionally, Mr. Allah has appeared on Urban Update (WHDH-TV, Boston) and National Public Radio (WBUR-Boston).

With a history that connects him to his clients on a more personal level, Mr. Allah combines his life experience and professional expertise to share his insight and the lessons learned with audiences across the Commonwealth. He has spoken at the Suffolk County House of Corrections, Massachusetts Correctional Institution (MCI) – (DOC), at various facilities within the Department of Youth Services (DYS), Buckingham, Browne & Nichols, and at various Boston Public Schools.
